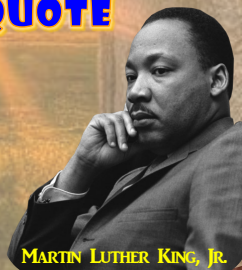

## The Times

- ❖ Over the last three months, the talk of the town—indeed the world—has been **the COVID-19 virus**.
- ❖ By May 27, the virus had infected over 1.7 million people, and had claimed the lives of over 100,000 in the U.S.A.
- ❖ Two days before, on May 25, a black man named George Floyd was accosted by policemen in the city of Minneapolis for allegedly tendering a counterfeit \$20 bill to make a purchase in a store.
- ❖ His encounter with the police, which—fortunately—was caught on camera, soon hit the news. Painfully, it showed George Floyd on the ground, and one of the police officers pressing his knee on his neck, resulting in his passionate cry, **“I can’t breathe.”** George later died.
- ❖ Soon, the news concerning the circumstances of his death went viral, resulting in peaceful demonstrations by thousands of people in every major city of the U.S.A. Sadly, there were incidents of looting, arson, destruction of property and violent activities also.
- ❖ Interestingly, the COVID-19 virus, which for over three months had filled the news cycle, was somewhat eclipsed by the news of George Floyd’s death and the nationwide demonstrations.
- ❖ Perspective summons us to remember that there is a logical connection between diagnosis and treatment. If you diagnose wrong, you treat wrong and vice versa.
- ❖ In this situation—as in many others—the heart of the matter is the matter of the heart. The absence of love in the human heart gives rise to hate, revenge, prejudices of all forms, greed, malice, injustice and, yes, death.
- ❖ On the other hand, love in the human heart will drive out hate, revenge, prejudices, greed, malice, and injustice. Yes, **“Love worketh no ill to his neighbour.”** (Romans 13:10)
- ❖ The late Martin Luther King was right when he said, **“Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that.”**
