OVID-19 represents for all of us a new path. We have never traveled this path before. And we never had the opportunity to rehearse for it.

There is a story from the pages of Biblical history that is a model not only for this moment, but for every new path that we shall be called upon to travel in the future.

The Biblical reference is Joshua 3:1-4. Here is a summary of the story.

- 1. The Israelites stood before the river lordan.
- 2. Behind them were forty years of weary wilderness journey.
- 3. Beyond the Jordan, was Canaan, the land of promise where fertile fields awaited them.
- 4. To get into Canaan, they had to cross the Jordan.
- 5. After standing before the Jordan for three days, the Israelites heard these words.
 - "3 When ye see the Ark of Covenant of the Lord your God, and the priests

the Levites bearing it, then ye shall remove from your place, and go after it. ⁴Yet there shall be a space between you and it about 2,000 cubits by measure: come not near unto it that ye may know the way by which ye must go: for ye have not passed this way heretofore." (Joshua 3:3-4)

The message to the Israelites was very clear. Their successful navigation of this new path was utterly dependent upon them being able to see the Ark which represented the presence of God. In like manner, we must focus on lesus in order to successfully travel this new path.

When Jehoshaphat faced the three-nation army, he uttered these words. "We have no might against this great company that cometh against us: neither know we what to do: but our eyes are upon **thee."** (2 Chronicles 20:12)

Keep your eyes on Jesus! He will see you through.

THE CORONAVIRUS! CHILLING & HEART-WARMING FACTS

The COVID-19 pandemic has produced both chilling and heart-warming facts. The former cover data on persons who have been infected and those who have died. The latter cover the good deeds of ordinary people.

We have decided to share with you some of these facts.

CHILLING

Eight persons were tested positively with the virus in the U.S. on March 8. By April 18, the number reached over

About 2 weeks ago, the British Government appealed for 250,000 people to sign up to help in various ways. 750,000 people responded.

Globally, over 2,250,000 persons have tested positively, and over 155,000 have died as at April 18.

A lady from Singapore purchased face masks from Vietnam and handed them to seniors who were waiting in public spaces without masks.

Nationally, over 700,000 persons have tested positively, and over 37,000 have died as at April 18.

Doctors, nurses and other health workers lined the hallway of a New York hospital and cheered while a patient with the virus was being discharged.

Of the over 37,000 deaths in the U.S. more than 7,000 occurred in nursing homes.

About 2 weeks ago, Korey Soderman, a young man with cerebral palsy, and his family were surprised by firefighters, who climbed their ladder to greet him on the balcony of his family's apartment.

As we move forward, we must always remember that real people are behind every relevant data. We should continue to pray for those who are sick as well as for family members of relatives who have died.

Also, we must ever be conscious that the most heart-warming of stories often emerge from nightmare-like experiences.
