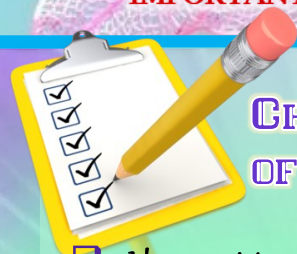

Today's theme is, **"YOU AND JESUS."** The relevant Biblical text is John 15:5. **"I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing."**

The text is clear. It shows that each of us is a branch. Most importantly, Jesus is the vine. When we abide in Him and He abides in us, we bear much fruit. The text ends with a statement that must never be forgotten. **"Without me, ye can do nothing."**

You and I are at our absolute best when we relate to Jesus appropriately. This process begins with salvation or deliverance from the power of sin. Jesus made salvation possible through His death, burial, and resurrection. We made salvation a reality by positively responding to the gospel. (Romans 1:16)

Christian Boundaries

The word, "boundary" denotes that which indicates a limit or a border line. Boundaries are important in family, business, and sporting relationships.

Among other things, boundaries are designed to create balance, establish value, and maintain safety. In some way, shape or form, we all believe in boundaries.

Our relationship with Jesus is more important than any other. We cannot live as Christians apart from Christ. Therefore, nothing should be said or done to negatively affect our relationship with Him.

The establishment of Christian boundaries facilitates adherence to Christian principles and ideals such as modesty in dress, and non-conformity to the world. (1 Timothy 2:9; Romans 12:1-2)

Christian boundaries are best viewed as instruments of protection, motivation, and value preservation. (Romans 14:12; Hebrews 10:24; Philippians 4:8)
