Opportunities in Challenges

Christians are never exempt from challenging experiences. The path that we travel is sometimes winding, steep and slippery.

One thing is sure. Jesus is always with us. And His presence guarantees His power which can impact our situation in ways that provide opportunities for us to have new and fresh visions of Jesus.

Consider the disciples who, in obedience to Jesus, were in a ship travelling across the sea of Galilee. They encountered a bad storm. So bad was the storm that after travelling for about nine hours they managed to cover only six of the twelve-mile journey.

Suddenly, in the fourth watch of night, Jesus appeared. When He went into the ship, two significant things happened. Firstly, the wind ceased. Yes, the storm was over. Secondly, the ship reached the land to which they travelled immediately.

This challenge gave the disciples the opportunity to see that Jesus was the Master of the storm as well as distance. (Mark 6:52; John 6:21) Six miles were covered immediately because of Jesus.

It must have been a real challenge for the little boy to give up his lunch when Jesus asked for it. However, his was the opportunity to see Jesus' amazing power in action. Jesus used the boy's five barley loaves and two small fish to feed the multitude which included five thousand men. And the boy saw it! What an opportunity! (John 6:5-12)

What challenges are you facing right now? Have you received a dreadful diagnosis? Are you going through an economic storm? Is there a dire family matter that has brought you indescribable pain?

Be still! You belong to Jesus. There is in your challenge an opportunity to have a new and fresh vision of Jesus. Look for it.
