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## My Encounter With COVID-19

**F**rom March 28 to April 4, I was most debilitated from illness than I had ever been in my entire adult life. It was comparable to my childhood experience of the measles.

The previous week, I had had an exposure history of fifteen (15) cases. The medical community seems to have been at war with this coronavirus. I felt like a soldier wounded early in the battle, while others fought on. I made up my mind to donate plasma when I recovered.

I spent most of my days in bed coughing, with chills, night sweats, slight shortness of breath, and severe muscle aches in my back. I had a vague headache, not a severe one. I prayed daily for my brothers and sisters hospitalized with this dreaded condition, as I realized my case was mild, as I did not feel the need to go to the hospital; yet, I was very sick.

I received calls from Pastor Dawson, Pastor Stewart, and Mother Dawson. Sister Norma Palmer called to let me know that she was praying. Sister Lorraine Gordon brought over pumpkin soup made by her mother, Vivienne Gordon. My husband, Desmond, thought that I was dying because I stayed in bed all day coughing, and moaning. The muscle pain was unbearable.

My condition improved gradually because of the strength of my immune system, and the effectiveness of prayer. I was able to get out of bed, and drink fluids. I lost my taste for food, and I lost thirteen (13) pounds that week. My appetite has slowly returned. I feel a sense of comradeship with those who have had COVID-19.

I will donate plasma next week. This soldier continues the battle.
