Today is celebrated as Palm Sunday on the Christian calendar. The four gospel writers, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John described Jesus' entry into Jerusalem.

Jesus came riding upon a young ass while the people who were in Jerusalem to celebrate the Feast of Passover, cried, "Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord." (John 12:13) They did so while waving palm branches.

Zechariah, the prophet, wrote about this. "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh unto thee: he is just, and having salvation, lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass." (Zechariah 9:9)

Essentially, Jesus was involved in a procession of sacrifice. It would culminate in his sacrificial death upon the cross in order to conquer sin and provide salvation for all mankind. Hallelujah!

In considering all that was involved in the mission of Jesus, the prophet issued a call for great rejoicing and shouting. Additionally, the prophet described Jesus as a righteous Savior clothed in humility.

THE CORONAVIRUS!

What A Road!



What a journey this has been for all of us—yes, all of us. The Coronavirus pandemic has affected everyone in some way, shape or form. Consider the following:

1. Since the virus has stuck the world and because of stay home requirements, people have been working at home. Indeed, many companies have helped employees to set up offices at home, to save them from being infected.
2. Schools have closed and teachers have been engaging with students through online classes.
3. Here at All Nations Apostolic Tabernacle (as is the case in many churches) members and guests have been participating in services only via livestream since March 22, 2020.
4. The 2020 Summer Olympics, scheduled to be held on July 24 to August 9 in Tokyo, has been postponed to 2021.
5. The Wimbledon Tennis Championships was cancelled for the first time since World War II.
6. On March 1, 2020, there were 89 persons who tested positively with the virus in the United States of America. By April 4, the total had reached 289,442.

The number of persons who had died reached 7,760.

7. Arising out of (6) above, we can only imagine the grief, pain and dislocations that family members have had to endure. Think of it.
 - The sick could not be visited by any relative.
 - The dead died alone as no relative was permitted to be present.
 - Also, the doctors, nurses and other healthcare workers on the frontline were overwhelmed by the magnitude of the problem.
8. As at April 3, 2020, about 10 million Americans had filed for unemployment benefits. This has resulted in enormous pain for so many.

Many times—in the course of living—it is through events like this that God can get our attention long enough to remind us that the primary purpose for which we were born is to love and serve Him in sincerity and truth. To take urgent action in fulfilling this primary purpose is the right thing to do.
