The theme on which we shall focus is, **"A MOST VALUABLE WEAPON."**

The Biblical text is Romans 8:28. **"And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose."**

Here are two relevant questions. What is the weapon under reference? And what are the outcomes of using it? The weapon under reference is the sword of the Spirit — the Word of God.

Let us parse the text. **"We know."** This speaks to certainty. This is a strong affirmation. What do we know? We know that all things—not some things—all things work together for good—not to everyone, but to those who love God, and are the called according to His purpose.

The outcomes of using this weapon are absolutely wonderful. Consider the following:

1. **Peace:** This is so regardless of how intense the suffering may be. And it provides a safeguard against being offended. (Psalm 119:165)
2. **Hope:** The night may be dark and long, but there lives a confident expectation of good, leading to an ongoing renewal of strength and the realization of progress continually. (Isaiah 40:31)
3. **Praise and Thanksgiving:** The voice of praise and thanksgiving is never silenced by pain, discomfort or great loss. (Acts 16:25; 1 Thess. 5:18)
4. **Rejoicing:** This lives through dangerous storms, crashing economies, and serious pandemics. (Philippians 4:4; 1 Peter 4:12-13; Habakkuk 3:17-18)

What a wonderful weapon! The trumpet summons us to use it continually.

It Works!

We like things that work. A mirror that reflects poorly is quickly discarded. Such is the fate of any other non-functioning thing.

On a spiritual level, we are blessed to have weapons that work. We must be unswervingly committed to using them. One such weapon is that which is covered by today's theme.

Classified under the sword of the Spirit, Romans 8:28 works when the doctor's diagnosis covers the dreaded disease of cancer. It works during long nights of pain, arising out of financial and social crises. It works in the presence of unfulfilled dreams. And it works when a casket bearing the motionless form of a child is being lowered into a grave.

The Bible is replete with persons who used this weapon. Job is a case in point. His trials arose out of God's vote of confidence in him, when He gave Satan permission to touch what he had. (Job 1:12)

Quickly, Satan went to work. When he was through, Job had lost all his oxen, asses, sheep, camels, children and almost all his servants. (Job 1:13-19)

When confronted with his great loss, Job brandished this most valuable weapon. He "shaved his head and fell down upon the ground, and worshipped, And said, Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:20-21)

Job's act and declaration gave proof of his love for God as well as his confidence in God's sovereignty and purpose. His use of this most valuable weapon saved him from feeling beaten, broken, and bitter.

As born-again believers, we can do likewise. Indeed, there are those among us who have been using this weapon for years. Do not stop using it. It will always work!
